Knights were fighting their last battles, peasants were rebelling, and cities were beds of seething unrest. Printing, tracts and battle anthems were bringing new ideas among the people, casting centuries-old beliefs into doubt. The success or failure of the Protestant movement was primarily decided in Southern Germany, in Franconia, Swabia and old Bavaria. Martin Luther followed the Diet of Augsburg of 1530, which everyone hoped would resolve the confessional issue, from Coburg Castle.

Precious exhibited objects from international collections and stories told with multimedia installations will enable visitors to the state exhibition in the imposing complex of Coburg Castle to experience the turn of the era around 1500.
